CHEETHAM HILL AND OUR NEIGHBOURS

Cheetham Hill has a bit of a bad rep in the city from some rioting in the 90s. However, most of our neighbours say that it is a fair area - that there are troublemakers, but that we'll be fine if we keep to ourselves. (Planting a church is definitely 'keeping to ourselves' isn't it?!).

During the past month in our streets, in shops and at the leisure centre, we have met Pakistanis, Bangladeshis, Iranians, Kurds, Nigerians, Afghans, Jews, Spanish, Ukranians, Poles, Somalis, Sudanese, Arabs, Syrians, Senegalese, Indians, Congolese, ... - oh, and Brits too! The diversity is amazing, but people really don't know each other and community is lacking as people keep to themselves. How much loneliness does that cause?

THE CHURCH PLANT

The plan is to launch in January. We (the planting team) have started meeting weekly for prayer, getting to know each other and planning with some wonderful people who are committed to or considering joining the plant. In the meantime, we've dispersed ourselves on a church-planting-learning-spree, spreading ourselves out amongst a few other church plants to learn from them, get some experience doing smaller church and, in the words of John, the network leader, "feel the pain" of church planting.

"ARE YOU HAVING A BREW ON?"

Turns out if a neighbour asks you this, they're inviting themselves in! 5 hours, a few life stories, some opinions about food and a gift of a tv later, we also had the privilege of hearing of this person's experience of church and God, and their desire to know God better.

-This is why we moved here!
